LBRDCJOINS PCUINDUSTRY PARTNER'S DAY

One of LBRDC's active academic partners is the Philippine Christian University (PCU). LBRDC's participation in the Industry Partner's Day was driven by its commitment to continuously improve the internship experience it offers. The corporation aimed to strengthen its collaborative relationship with PCU and explore the development of standardized internship guidelines that would benefit both the students and the partner institutions. The event provided a meaningful avenue for exchanging insights and best practices with other industry stakeholders.

A roundtable discussion was held during the event, focusing on three main topics: curriculum and practicum alignment, workplace readiness and skills development, and opportunities for deeper industry collaboration. On the topic of workplace readiness, the participants agreed on the importance of equipping students with both soft and technical skills to help them thrive in organizational environments. Lastly, collaboration opportunities such as guest lectures, participation in job fairs, training programs, and potential research partnerships were explored to further support student growth and institutional linkages.

The event proved to be a productive and engaging platform for LBRDC to reaffirm its support for youth development through internship programs. It also served as an opportunity to establish stronger ties with PCU and other industry partners, paving the way for enhanced training programs that respond effectively to the evolving needs of the workforce.
